1/ NEW: EXPERIENCE A UNIQUE NIGHT AT THE NEW GRAMUSSET REFUGE HUT

Gramusset, also known as the Pointe Percée refuge hut, the highest point in the Aravis mountain range in the commune of Grand-Bornand, is the latest major project undertaken by the CAF (French Alpine Club) as regards its refuges. It has just undergone an extensive renovation programme, with the construction of a brand-new chalet and with 36 beds shared with the historic refuge dating from 1928, which has been improved. The outdated wing built in the 1970s has been removed. Thanks to a budget of €2,650,000, the Gramusset refuge - which is both a hiking destination for families and a stopover point on the routes which criss-cross the Aravis mountain range and the surrounding lapiaz (classified as a Natura 2000 site) - is now virtually self-sufficient in terms of energy as a result of a renovation project of high environmental quality which has been hailed as exemplary.

2/LE CHEMIN DES TYROLIENNES

This unusual activity, which combines walking and aerial activities, is located about thirty minutes from Annecy in Talloires-Montmin. A guide accompanies the brave through our forests and mountains, and to the foot of La Tournette in particular - the highest peak around Lake Annecy. The hike starts at the Pré Verel refuge, at an altitude of 1,200 m in the heart of the mountain pastures, and is accompanied by crossing the woods via several zip lines: two on the way up and three on the way down. Optional during the activity: Visit to the Col de l'Aulp farm with lunch in the restaurant.

3/ NEW: TAKE TO THE HEIGHTS IN A GONDOLA SUSPENDED... FROM A LARGE BALLOON

Starting from La Clusaz, experience the pleasure of free flight while admiring the Aravis mountain range from the sky! This is a unique opportunity to soar above the Alpine peaks and admire breathtaking sights such as Mont Blanc, the Col des Aravis and the Pointe Percée! Flight duration: approx. 1 hr 15 min. 4/ SEVEN MOUNTAIN REFUGE HUTS IN THE THÔNES CŒUR DES VALLÉES REGION

There are seven mountain rescue huts dotted around the mountains in the vast Thônes Cœur des Vallées region, which extends from La Tournette to Le Parmelan, the Plateau de Beauregard, Le Charvin and Les Dents de Lanfon. They open their doors to hikers looking for a night away from it all or for multi-day treks! Lasting from two to four days, and depending on your level of fitness, the itineraries suggested allow you to reach the high altitude refuges. These are timeless places where the wardens are always happy to provide a good rest and to share and offer advice to hikers to help them tackle the gradients in the peace and quiet of unspoilt surroundings! 1/ FROM 'TAILLANDIER' TO KNIFE-MAKER... A DESTINY WAITING TO HAPPEN!

Stephen Taillandier worked on knives in restaurants in the area for a long time. He now welcomes visitors to his workshop nestled in the hills of Saint-Jean-de-Sixt, where he shares his passion for knife-making. A self-taught craftsman, he talks as much about the techniques of working iron to create his blades in their thousands of shapes and patterns as he does about the different types of wood, from the rarest to the most common, which he finds, collects or buys. The magic of working with the material works, and his ideas result in truly unique pieces. An unusual experience hosted by a true St. John-style figure and person which the region has adopted as one of its own, who does not hesitate to remind us that his destiny was ultimately a foregone conclusion.

From the milking of the cows to the maturing stage in the cellar, the 'cream of cheeses' prized by hikers reveals the secrets of its flavour and unmistakable texture during a final tasting with the producer.


1/ THE 200-YEAR-OLD ETOUVIÈRES SAWMILL HAS BEEN TRANSFORMED INTO AN ECOMUSEUM AND A FOREST SCHOOL.

For 30 years, the Écomusée du Bois et de la Forêt has been offering visitors a journey back in time to discover this former 19th century hydraulic sawmill over the course of a lively tour which includes sawing demonstrations. A special anniversary will be celebrated on the weekend of 1 and 2 July with numerous free events for all ages. At the same time, a 'school forest', in collaboration with Thônes Town Hall, is being created at the sawmill's entrance. This multi-educational forest aims to be a place of experimentation which addresses the different aspects of the forest and the needs and/or aspirations of local stakeholders, including environmental education, forest management, vocational training, agriculture, citizen participation, environmental protection and the local economy.

2/LA SOURCE, A FUN AND OFFBEAT EXPLORATION OF THE ALPS FOR THE WHOLE FAMILY...

In the setting of a traditional farm in Le Grand-Bornand, La Source has three levels with various spaces for mediation and workshops, an educational farm, and exhibition and performance rooms. There are also works in permanent residence which enliven the site. The 'Arbre à jouer' (play tree), the centrepiece of the outdoor spaces, houses free and cooperative games which follow one after another from log to log, inviting young and old alike to have fun together based on life in the mountains. Milk churns, coffee grinders and old skis are used as mediums - often in different ways - to create funny and instructive challenges... as well as two ecological rides powered by parents! Some of what's new for 2023: another upcycled ecological ride, the exploration of a giant marmot burrow designed, like all the structures in the park, by specialists in active education, two monumental works of art including a tribute to Swiss cuckoo clocks and an imaginary depiction of the giant Gargantua's stay in the Alps, etc... 1 June to 17 September

4/A TOUR OF ALBY-SUR-CHÉRAN

This old medieval village situated at the foot of Le Semnoz and on the banks of the river Chéran offers a tourist trail called 'Suivez la mouche' (Follow the fly) which reveals this village's natural and architectural heritage in 12 sections. The itinerary includes stops at the Musée de la Cordonnerie (museum of shoemaking), Notre-Dame de Plaimpalais church and the river Chéran, where gold panning was developed. The village of Alby-sur-Chéran is particularly well known for its shoemakers, weavers and tanners. The route takes about an hour and is about 2 km long.

Additional information: A free edutainment course is available on two platforms: ViAnnecy and izi.TRAVEL. There are also information boards in the village - the Musée de la Cordonnerie is free.





5/SOURCES DU LAC D'ANNECY

Saint-Jean-Baptiste, a church full of surprises. Archaeological excavations have brought to light some surprising things in the church at Faverges-Seythenex. Behind its austere Romanesque façade from the second half of the 12th century, it contains many treasures, including a crypt in which traces of a Roman building estimated to have been built between the 1st and 4th centuries can be seen, as well as traces of early churches.
