






MGM (MANIGOD): A NEW HOLIDAY APARTMENT BUILDING, THE 'HAMEAU DE L'OURS'

1/ MOONLIT SKI TOURING & NIGHT IN A TIPI

Cross-country skiing is an adventure on skis, where you'll feel like you're the very first to venture onto the virgin snow. Skiing at night with the moon lighting your way is a whole new sensation in the heart of a fairytale landscape. Peace and quiet reign supreme for this experience. Make the most of your evening as the Thônes guides take you for a night in a mountain teepee, deep in the heart of the peaks, for a starry night and a stunning wake-up call as the day gently breaks.

2/AN ICE'CITING EXPERIENCE: CLIMB THE ICE FALLS

When the temperatures plunge and winter arrives, the flowing waters turn into a fabulous playground. 3/ AN APERITIF AT THE TOP OF THE SEMNOZ!



5/A TASTE OF THE FAR NORTH IN MANIGOD

Let yourself be guided by mushers Brice and Orlane, while you sit pretty and enjoy a ride in the great wide open with a Northern touch. The wind on your face, the sound of the dogs barking and the crunch of the snow beneath the sledge, surrounded by conifer trees and snowy peaks. What a way to discover this winter activity. As well as the dog-sledding trip, you get to learn about life in the pack and spend some quality time with the dogs, helping to set them up for the ride. The activity lasts one hour in total: 30-minute ride + 30 minutes meeting the musher.

7 THE OUTSTANDING GRAMUSSET REFUGE

Gramusset Refuge is also known as the Refuge de la Pointe Percée, and has recently been renovated and a whole new chalet to sleep 36 was built alongside the historic refuge dating from 1928, which itself was given a makeover and the old-fashioned wing from the 1970s was knocked down. Set in a limestone environment that is listed as a Natura 2000 area, Gramusset is now almost entirely self-sufficient in terms of energy, thanks to top-quality, cutting-edge environmental renovation. This is one of the only refuges run by the CAF (French Alpine Club) that is open and manned in winter, and it stands guard over the Aravis mountains with a sheer drop down across the valley, making it a popular place for ski-touring in the region.

1/STARSKI TRAINS BUDDING LITTLE TRAPPERS!

The 'Little Trappers' workshop is organised by the Starski ski school in Le Grand-Bornand and offers children from the age of 5 to really embrace their experience in the mountains. These nature outings led by Sébastien Fontanel, ski instructor and mountain guide, combine sports and discovery and the little adventurers will be taking part in a treasure hunt on snowshoes, observe their surroundings using binoculars and learn about the survival techniques in the forest (lighting a fire in the snow or building a makeshift shelter)!

2/ DECORATIVE, CULINARY POTTERY AT JULIE'S STUDIO IN HÉRY-SUR-ALBY

Julie has been working with glazed pottery (red clay, often covered with white or coloured metallic oxide slip) to create simple or decorated pieces for 18 years now on her family's old farm. The pottery is covered with a translucent glaze and then baked at 1,000°C in a kiln, to create crockery with simple designs and playful, colourful decoration. 3/ 'PAPI JO': A PULLED PORK BURGER WITH... RALPH LAUREN!

Papi Jo is a restaurant in a wooden cabin overlooking Le Grand-Bornand, run by the smartly dressed Lucas Janier (Papi Jo) and his team who serve quality cuisine using fresh products, accompanied by a wine list and selection of inspired coffees and fruit juices, around the fire or fire pit out on the terrace. Come here to grab a guick bite to eat or take the time to appreciate the comfort of an old leather sofa and admire the view of the slopes down below. The menu features a selection of the best trapper-style dishes in a Ralph Lauren, gentleman farmer style atmosphere, inspired by the spectacular Colorado ranch. The atmosphere and decoration go perfectly well together, creating a striking effect that will whisk skiers away on a journey across borders and through time!



4/ AT THE MAISON BÉTEMPS, SPECIALIST BAKERS SINCE 1932, THE TRADITIONAL 'BESCOINS' FLY OFF THE SHELVES!

Four generations of bakers and pastry chefs at the helm of this institution in the culinary world of Le Grand-Bornand. Bruno Bétemps & sons, Quentin and Félix, only work with local products. Among other delicious delights, the 'bescoin' which comes from the word 'biscuit', is a 100% local ancient tradition that is not very widely known. The Princes of Savoie were great fans of this little soft brioche with a hint of aniseed and saffron, and they are still traditionally offered to loved ones at the 'Fête Patronale Bornadine' on 15 August. The Bétemps family bake them every weekend, all year round. Their top tip: "Enjoy your bescoin with some butter and mountain honey". Yum!



5/FLORENCE MULIARDO SCULPTS AND PAINTS GIANT TEETH AS A TRIBUTE TO HER SON.

Florence Muliardo is a self-taught visual artist and works under her brand MULIARDO FQD. She is well-known for her incredible, 2-metre-high sculptures of women and is now showcasing her artistic talent through another theme: teeth, which she believes symbolise life. She believes that a tooth's two solid roots embody the concepts of life, sharing and family. She came up with the



idea for this artistic project when her son Quentin suddenly passed away at the age of 20. At her studio in Thônes, each tooth is sculpted and then decorated with a character from a comic strip - a passion she shared with Quentin - and then marked with a

sign in tribute to her son. These teeth are unique and personal works of art and have been exhibited at the Grand Palais in Paris, as well as New York, Tokyo and Miami. The exhibition is soon coming to her hometown, to mark the Saison Culturelle de Thônes event.

6/ALTITUDE B & B

A new concept that now means the Là-Haut refuge is accessible to everyone. Once reserved just for groups, the refuge is now also open to families looking to experience a wonderful overnight stay at 1,830 m.

You can expect:

- To wake up and enjoy breakfast while watching the chamois, from €200 based on 2 people sharing (+€60 per extra person).
- Comfortable dormitory-style rooms that sleep up to 6.

#/LE GRIZZLY

Originally from Savoie, Edouard Loubet chose to return to the Alps, more specifically to the La Clusaz-Manigod ski area. The restaurant Le Grizzly is the ideal opportunity for a fine-dining experience with the reblochon cheese pie or smoked rack of lamb with thyme for example. Edouard Loubet's mountain cuisine showcases local products he collects from local producers. The restaurant is at an altitude of 1,635 m and the superb panoramic view takes people by surprise, day after day. Open every lunchtime during the winter season, and in evenings for private functions - Beauregard Sector. Edouard Loubet has the Bocuse d'Or in his sights! He is one of the six lucky French candidates to have been selected for the Bocuse d'Or (international culinary competition) that takes place in September.

8/CATHY COHENDET, MOUNTAIN GUIDE FOR THE PAST 30 YEARS.

"The mountain is where I feel liberated. After my agricultural studies and after spending a few summer seasons at Paccaly Alpine pastures, I decided to become a qualified mountain guide. This winter will be my 30th season at Manigod ESF ski school. I still take great pleasure in sharing and passing on my passion for nature and the mountains on my guided outings. Les Follières is my favourite place, a place I'll never get tired of, a magical place in all seasons."
