Annecy Mountains is an unbeatable destination in the French Alps for all cycling disciplines.



# A FIRST-RATE WELCOME







### **ACCUEIL VÉLO**

"Accueil Vélo" is a national label that guarantees a high-quality welcome and services along cycle routes aimed at touring cyclists, in particular.

The "Accueil Vélo" seal of approval is a guarantee for cyclists that an establishment:

- is located less than 5 km from a cycling route
- offers facilities for cyclists: secure bike shelter, repair kit, etc.
- offers an appropriate welcome (practical information, recommendations, itineraries, weather reports, etc.)
- provides services for visitors travelling by bike: luggage transfer, laundry facilities, bike rental and cleaning.

## VILLE ET TERRITOIRE VÉLOTOURISTIQUES

Set up by the French Cycle Tourism Federation (FFCT), the «Cycling City and Territory» label recognizes local authorities that offer cyclists a warm welcome, services, and appropriate facilities and act towards the development of sustainable cycling tourism.

### **BASE VTT**

The "Base VTT" Label rewards tourist structures and communities that offer mountain bikers a warm welcome with services and equipment that they need to make the best use of the MTB opportunities in the region. It guarantees fantastic benefits such as marked trails available to all skill levels, better safety conditions, and a system to ensure that all participating mountain bikers are mindful of other trail users and respectful to the environment.

# ROUTE DES GRANDES ALPES®

The Route des Grandes Alpes® links Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean, crossing the French Alps from north to south or from south to north, from Thonon-les-Bains (74) to Nice (06). The Route des Grandes Alpes® is a 720 km tourist cycle route which crosses the French Alps from north to south, passing through 17 mountain passes, 6 of which are more than 2 000 metres above sea level

The Route des Grandes Alpes® follows the routes of the Annecy Mountains, via the Col de la Colombière mountain pass at Le Grand-Bornand, Saint-Jean-de-Sixt and the Col des Aravis pass at La Clusaz.

The "Lake Annecy" alternative of the Route des Grandes Alpes\* offers you the chance to discover a completely new route linking Le Grand-Bornand to Lescheraines. Head along the Col du Marais pass, Val Sulens, Faverges and the Tour du Lac d'Annecy greenway to Saint-Jorioz and then the climb to the Col de Leschaux pass, this route offers magnificent views of Lake Annecy, the Bauges mountain range and its geopark.

A gravel version is also available along the routes of the Annecy Mountains. From Cluses, the route leads to Le Grand-Bornand along picturesque back roads before reaching the Col de la Colombière pass. A second gravel route leaving from Le Grand-Bornand takes you to Lac des Confins and the Col des Aravis pass at La Clusaz before you head along the "Route de la Soif", a superb rolling ledge path which precedes a beautiful wild descent to Flumet.


# **ROUTES MAPS**

### ROAD AND GRAVEL CYCLING

Whether you're a touring cyclist or riding for sport, set off to discover Annecy Mountains.

Combining lake and mountain landscapes, Annecy Mountains offers a year-round experience with trails that are accessible for the whole family or to enjoy with friends. From the shores of Lake Annecy to the hills of the hinterland, all the way to the farthest reaches of the Genevois region, hop on your bike and get away from it all.

Annecy Mountains is an alpine location, rich and varied for people in search of sporting challenges. Since 1939, the region has often been showcased in the grand alpine stages of the Tour de France. Climbers have long tried to defy the clock on the mythical passes and routes carved out in the heart of the Aravis, Tournette and Semnoz mountain ranges.





### MOUNTAIN BIKING AND E-BIKING

There's something for everyone!

The region offers a wide range of trails for mountain biking, **covering several disciplines and different levels of ability:** mountain-bike rides across the entire area, cross-country with numerous loop trails, enduro and downhill.

**4 lift-equipped sites** provide access to downhill and enduro runs, as well as 2 bike parks (Le Semnoz and La Clusaz).



# **GROUP ACCOMMODATION**



In Annecy Mountains, there is a range of large-capacity establishments to welcome you, with all the comforts and services that cyclists need.

From campsites and hotels to holiday villages, gîtes and high-end chalets, this destination has a varied offering to satisfy everyone.

Some accommodation options also have facilities and **wellness areas** for relaxing after a day's ride.

# THE "ACCUEIL VÉLO" LABEL

The "Accueil Vélo" ("Cyclists Welcome") label is issued by France Vélo Tourisme to various types of structures: accommodation providers, hire companies, repair shops, restaurants, tourist offices, sites to visit and leisure activities.

Choosing a site with the "Accueil Vélo" label means:

- a warm, personalised welcome with information and advice tailored to cyclists,
- free, secure parking for your bike,
- the option of leaving your panniers attached without worrying,
- sockets for recharging your phone and GPS.
- the ability to recharge the battery of your electric bicycle at least overnight at your stopover,
- a full repair kit at hand in case of a problem.

### These service providers can offer different transfer services:


- ARRIVAL TRANSFER & RETURN TRANSFER: from airport/station to the hotel.

# LET'S SHARE THE MOUNTAINS

### The mountains bring us pleasure and must be shared and respected.

Hikers, mountain bikers and other users share the mountain trails to enjoy their favourite pastimes. Behind the beauty of these spaces lies a whole history, as well as farming activities and people's homes.

To help you plan your mountain biking trips while respecting shared use of mountain areas, an interactive map includes the MAP PATOU feature that shows the location of mountain pastures that are protected by guardian dogs.

### WHERE ARE THE MOUNTAIN DOGS?

### HOW TO BEHAVE

Cyclists: get off your bike as soon as you can and walk with it. For reassurance, place your bike between you and the dog.







# SHUTTLE SERVICES WITH BIKE RACKS



You can use public transport to travel quickly and easily around the Annecy Mountains region with your bike.

### Take your bike on the bus:

- from Annecy, several regular bus routes allow you to travel from Annecy to Albertville or the Aravis resorts
- during the summer season, take the bus to the top of the Semnoz ,
- buses equipped with bike racks allow you to travel between the various resorts in the Aravis Bus network. Limit: 6 bikes.

### Lake Annecy boat buses:

 every day throughout the summer, the Compagnie des Bateaux's Navibus boat buses serve the various ports on Lake Annecy.

Located along roads and cycle paths, bike cafés are establishments dedicated to welcoming cyclists and offering a wide range of "cycling-friendly" services.


